I called a few people and finally got ahold of him I was balling my eyes out he could tell over he phone .. it was after midnight I told him what was happening and with in 30 minutes he was all the out where I live out on little goose with me two jugs of waters a pack of cigarettes something to eat even brought flash lights and tools so he could fix my generator so I wouldn't be up alone in the dark.... And he wouldn't take the money I had for him bring that stuff to me and what I was gonna pay him for fixing my crap.... He was the only man who came to help me in my

time of need and I really truly hate that he is gone now.. and that I'll never get to look into his eyes every again or to see his caring smiling again but your in a better place buddy... Rest in peace my best friend and kinda watch over us all we all need your really loved Jason and gonna be missed forever I really hate your not gonna be here and more . Smile down on me and I'll fill you when God calls my name and I got home to

Everyone this man had a bad name in our town my I can say with my whole heart this man would take the shirt right for his back for some one if they needed it he was a good friend to me and my husband and we will forever miss him
