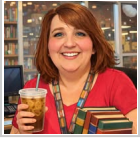
He was preceded in death by his father, John Fieler.

A Memorial Service honoring Joshua John Fieler will be held at a later date determined by the family. The family has entrusted House-Rawlings Funeral Home with the arrangements.

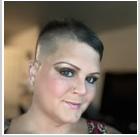
